

Study Results: Enrollment



Across the 10 study sites, there are approximately 60,000 participants who are enrolled with an average age of 51and regularly completing their daily survey. The graph to the left breaks down these participants by age. Visit our website for more study results and an interactive map!

Featured FAQs

Can I be a part of the study if I get the vaccine?

A: Yes! In fact, by participating after you have received your vaccine you could help us understand the impact of the vaccine on virus spread in the community and also how our bodies are responding to the vaccine in terms of antibody production.

Will I test positive for antibodies if I got the vaccine?

A: Timing is key! If it has only been a couple of days since you received the vaccine, it is likely you will test negative; but after two weeks, you will likely test positive.

An Interview w/Dr. John Sanders, Principal Investigator

Dr. John Sanders, Chief of Infectious Diseases within the Wake Forest Baptist Health network, is also one of the principal investigators on the COVID-19 Community Research Partnership.
